Instead, please report inappropriate comments, project updates, and replies by getting in touch with our [Community Support](#) team. Please be sure to include a hyperlink to the page where the content appears on ResearchGate, as well as a screenshot of the exact content you're reporting. This gives us the information we need to find it on site. Please also include your reason for reporting.


## How do I report a comment added to a publication page?

Here's how to report a comment added to a publication page:

1. Find the comment you want to report
2. Click on  at the top right-hand side of the comment
3. Select **Report**
4. On the following screen, give the reason you're reporting the comment
5. Click **Report** to confirm.

## How do I report a project update?

Here's how to report a project update:

1. Find the update you want to report
2. Click on the title of the update
3. Click on  at the top right-hand side of the post
4. Select **Report**
5. On the following screen, give the reason you're reporting the update
6. Click **Report** to confirm.

## How do I report a reply to a comment or project update?

Here's how to report a reply that has been added to a publication page comment or project update:

1. Find the reply you want to report
2. Click **Report** under the text of the reply
3. On the following screen, give the reason you're reporting the reply
4. Click **Report** to confirm.
